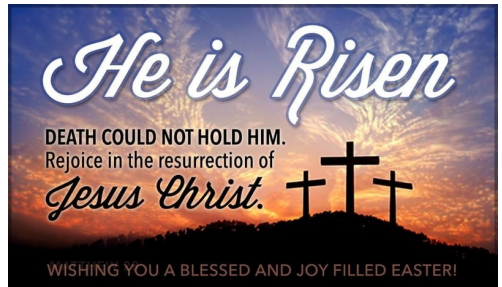
The Resurrection of Christ

#set them free—Refugees released!

Two Anglican Melbourne bishops (Bishop Paul Barker and Bishop Phillip Huggins) locked themselves in a cage for eight minutes outside the Park Hotel in Carlton to protest inhumane detention of refugees and asylum seekers in Australia a few weeks ago. Dozens of detainees have been held there for up to eight years and this came to light when Novak Djokovic was detained there as well. Bishop Paul writes:

“Hooray!!! All of the refugees who were locked up in the Park Hotel in Carlton & other refugees from different detention facilities who came through medevac are free! We have been advocating for this with many others for quite a while. Great news!!”

Thanks to everyone who helped with the market last Saturday, donated goods and bought items. We made over \$1600 which was an amazing effort.

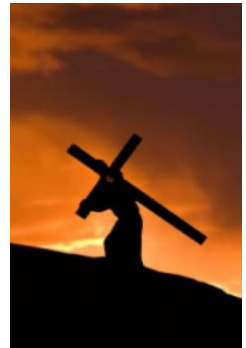

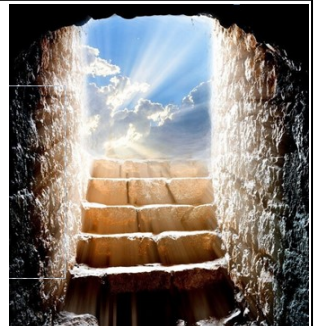
