Thomas Cranmer

Thomas Cranmer (1489-1556) was the most significant figure in the Protestant Reformation in England. Born in Nottinghamshire in 1489, Cranmer became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1533 under Henry VIII and was in this role when the Church broke away from Rome. In 1548, with the support of Henry's son Edward VI, Cranmer replaced parts of the Latin Mass with English (prayer and confession). He put an English Bible in every church and started reworking the Mass itself. The following year Cranmer published a new English prayer book (which he improved in 1552), rejecting the central Catholic teaching of transubstantiation (i.e. that the bread and wine actually became the body and blood of Christ). Cranmer taught that Jesus Christ alone is the perfect sacrifice for our sins and therefore there is no need for a continued priestly sacrifice. Under Cranmer, Holy Communion stopped being a sacrifice and became a remembrance meal. When Edward died and Catholic 'Bloody' Queen Mary took the throne, she executed almost 290 protestant dissenters, including Archbishop Cranmer. In jail awaiting execution, Cranmer cracked and recanted of his Protestantism. However, in the moments before his execution in Oxford, he switched again, recanting his previous recantation and reaffirming his rejection of Catholicism. As he was being burnt Cranmer forced his right arm—the arm that had scribed the original recantation—into the flames in a visual display of allegiance to the Bible's teaching of Christ's sacrifice once for all.
