# Who were the gospels written for?

The Gospels record Christ's ministry to the four groups. The Jews loved the Scriptures and the prophecies of God. They would only listen to one of their own. So Matthew speaks to the Jews and the deeply religious of our day.

Mark spoke to the Romans. These were the leaders and leadership and action impressed them. They knew nothing of Scriptures but everything of power. So to this group comes the action-packed Gospel of the powerful ministry of Christ. Mark uses the word and 1,375 times to tie together the endless actions of Christ. Like our modern successful business men and women, they want a God who can powerfully meet their deepest needs.

Luke was a Greek speaking to the Greeks. The Greeks loved culture, beauty and ideas. Happiness could be found in the pursuit of truth. Luke fills his book with insights, interviews, songs, and details that fascinate the inquiring mind. So today the truth seekers find Jesus in Luke! John wrote to everyone, because everyone needs to meet God and only Jesus can reveal Him. In this book we meet an absolutely powerful God in human flesh who controls and rules the Universe He created. So the best known verse is the best of all, that God loves all and offers all - His Son as their only hope!

## **Sensible Shoes**

In third term we are starting a new small group for women. It will be a sacred journey style group where we will reflect on the novel called Sensibole Shoes by Sharon Garlough Brown and there will be a Bible study that closely follows what is presented in the book.

You can borrow the book from Robyn or Sue or purchase it from Koorong. It's also available on Audible. In this experience you would be introduced to the spiritual disciplines of Lectio Divina, the prayer of examen, journaling, labyrinth prayer, praying with imagination, and spiritual direction while also learning to become a more attentive listener to God through sitting in silence. We envisage that the study will take 12 weeks, and there will be about 6 participants. It could be fortnightly on a Saturday afternoon, weekly on a weekday, or evening, depending on the participants. If you are interested in sharing this experience, and are prepared to read the book beforehand and do some study or practical exercises between sessions, please contact Robyn Wheatley or Sue.

# **New compliance**

We are holding a session on Sunday 28 August after the 10 am service for those who would like to do this in person rather than on line.
