Human hope is a fragile thing, and when it withers it's difficult to revive. Hopelessness as a disease of the human spirit is desperately hard to cure. With the two men on the road to Emmaus, Jesus was the one who sought them out. He came up and walked alongside them. The heart seeking encounter was Jesus initiative. He knew what was going through their minds, he knew exactly how they felt and he met them right where they were at.

The Emmaus Two had erected a wall of hopelessness around them, and

they were trapped in their misery. "We had hoped ..." What they were saying is "We don't expect it now, but once we did. We had it, this thing called hope, but now it's gone." Towards the end we see that their eyes were opened and they recognised that Jesus had been with them all of the time. Only Jesus can turn our feelings of hopelessness into those of joy and hopefulness.

Many of us have at times walked the Emmaus road. wondering where God is... when all along He walks beside us.
