Some thoughts regarding voting next weekend

I remember when I heard that the Pope shocked people by taking the bus home (instead of the bullet-proof pope-mobile) after being sworn in and then paying his bill for his lodgings before moving out. It was a quiet but powerful indication that he was a leader who would not claim special treatment, nor encourage other religious leaders to. His refusal to sit on the papal throne and his welcoming of children who interrupted his sermons displayed a humility that I rarely see in world leaders. Regardless of whether we agree with his theology, his approach to leadership is challenging and inspiring. His death is not just a loss to the Catholic Church, but also to humanity.

As we head into an election period in Australia, I encourage you to consider what a humble Prime Minister (or local Member of Parliament), who has no sense of entitlement, would look like...

Is the person you're voting for welcoming of all people, slow to judge, kind and generous with their time and resources and tough on financial misappropriation and wastage? Do they care about both justice and mercy? Do they exist to serve the least in society and actively invest their time and energy into them? Do they humbly lead by example? If they don't fit this description, then what do they actually stand for? And if you vote for them, what do you stand for at your core? I'm not interested in telling people who to vote for. But I'm very keen on people learning how to wisely make their own minds up. Whoever it is in your local area, I encourage you to vote for a good leader, not just a self-serving figurehead.
