Archbishop election process

A Board of Nominators has met over the last several months to select candidates to be submitted to the Election Synod for consideration. On Thursday May 23 the Board will introduce the candidates to the Synod which is made up of clergy and elected lay representatives from each parish in the Diocese. When all the candidates have been introduced a debate is held on the merits of each candidate. At the conclusion of the debate, a secret ballot is taken with one candidate's name written on the voting paper. Where there are 4 or 3 candidates, the candidate who received the lowest total number of votes is eliminated, and another ballot is held between the remaining candidates. If, on a ballot, a candidate receives the votes of not less than two-thirds of the clerical members and not less than two-thirds of the lay members present at the meeting, the candidate is duly elected. Please pray for the election process that all those involved will listen carefully to the debates, seek to discern God's will, show charity and love toward those who come from different traditions and hold different opinions. At this time in the life of the Anglican Church we need a strong leader, with a clear faith and a solid vision for the future.
